Linda and the leadership team at Home of Hope write:

"We are incredibly grateful to you and to all our faithful MOF prayer supporters who continually lift us up in prayer. Your love, unwavering support and generous donations are a true blessing to Home of Hope. Thank you for standing with us in faith. We pray for God's continued blessing upon you all."

Psalm 136:1 calls God's people to praise Him with gratitude and trust. As the psalmist proclaims God's enduring love, we invite you to give thanks to God together with Home of Hope.

- A strong maize harvest has secured the daily food supply for the children and the bean crop looks very promising for another successful harvest.
- "God has blessed our students' hard work." A significant number of children have been selected to pursue higher education at universities and colleges. This is a massive achievement for the students and Home of Hope.
- Good health among the children, with a notably low incidence of malaria and illness, has followed the generous provision of mosquito nets and the availability of medicines at the hospital.
- Funds raised through tickets for an art workshop in Bedford and the sale of artwork created by HOH students will purchase much needed desks for the schools at HOH. In a creative partnership, MOF welcomed John Platt, New York artist and founder of the charity How to Draw a Lion, who teaches art to the children at HOH each summer. We thank God for his work, his generosity and for the members of the local community who took part in this inspirational event.

Psalm 136:1 was also proclaimed in faith by Jehoshaphat and the people of God when they faced overwhelming challenges (2 Chronicles 20:21). With the same gratitude and trust, please pray for:

- Urgent infrastructure needs: Essential work is required on waste systems and the bathroom and toilets at the Vocational Training Centre so that the appointment of government teachers can proceed without delay. Please lift up all current infrastructure projects—including school and technical college upgrades—that they may be completed successfully.
- Financial provision: "We pray that God will open new financial doors and provide the resources needed to sustain our large family." The current economic climate is extremely challenging. Food prices have doubled in recent months, HOH have had to reduce spending on essentials and some staff contracts have unfortunately had to be terminated to comply with government wage guidelines.
- Increased giving and support: Let us pray boldly that MOF will be able to contribute £6,000 per month—almost double our current donor income—to meet these growing needs. Pray that God will expand our network among supporters, churches, local communities, businesses, and grant-making bodies and inspire generous hearts. Pray also for willing volunteers to assist with the administrative work of the charity.
- Unity and leadership: Please pray that love, harmony and peace continue to flourish among the children, staff and the entire HOH community. Pray for the leadership team—for good health, courage, wisdom in stewarding resources and for protection amid the economic and climate-related challenges.

- MOF rebrand: More than 50% of the children now receiving care and education at Home of Hope are not orphans, but highly vulnerable children from the surrounding community. As MOF's name no longer fully reflects this work, the trustees have been prayerfully developing a rebrand. Give thanks for God's guidance and timely professional connections, and pray for clarity of vision, wise decisions and an outcome that honours God and serves Home of Hope and all MOF supporters well.
