Everything they received is being used or being stored until it is needed. The items which are clearly in use are office furniture, shoes, clothes, school uniform and school desks.

The change in how the students are learning at school with clean uniform and desks to work at is clearly visible.

Grace Pads



Grace Pads was set up by Australians; Christie and Erin, 3 years ago. It is an initiative that trains young women from Home of Hope who have graduated in textile manufacturing, and the making of reusable sanitary pads. The project manager; Cynthia, was one of the first graduates of the vocational programme run by Home of Hope and Grace Pads.



The women who are trained earn a formal qualification and either continue to work for Grace Pads or go out into Malawi to gain another career in textile manufacturing. Grace Pads is therefore an amazing project, enabling young women to learn great skills, gain employment and build a better life for themselves.

Beyond this, Grace Pads provides invaluable empowerment for the young girls within Home of Hope and the surrounding villages, something that Cynthia is incredibly passionate about. Without Grace Pads, many girls are forced to miss a quarter of their schooling due to menstruation. Every girl at Home of Hope is given a kit of Grace Pads.



This is only a snap shot of what Grace Pads is about. Malawi Orphan Fund is passionate about this project and how empowering it is to girls not just at Home of Hope but throughout Malawi and we hope you will be to.
